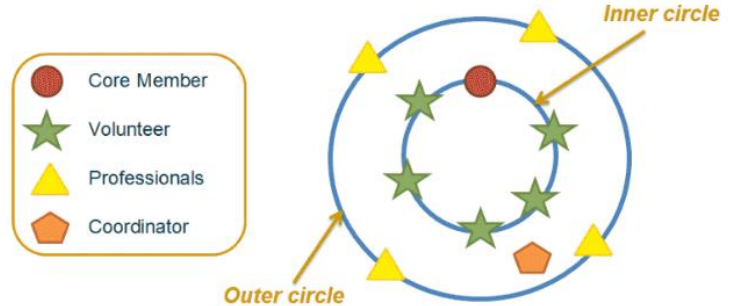


Evaluation of Project *CerclesCat*

What is *CerclesCat* (Circles of Support and Accountability - CoSA)?

It is a program that provides **support** and **supervision** of sex offenders who are deemed moderate or high risk of sexual recidivism and are in the previous stages of their release, in order to enhance their social reintegration and to prevent them from committing a new offense.



-  **No secrets**
- No more victims**

***CerclesCat's* aim is to reduce the risk of recidivism in sex offenders**

Who can participate?

- 1) Inmates with **moderate** or **high** risk of recidivism (according to specific assessments)
- 2) With **deficits** in their social, work or family environment
- 3) They have **successfully** participated in specific treatment for sex offenders in prison
- 4) They show **accountability** for their crime and motivation to change
- 5) **Volunteering** to participate in *CerclesCat* (CoSA)

Who can't?

- 1) High score in **psychopathy**
- 2) Severe cognitive deficit

What is being done to ensure monitoring, support and control?



- Professional support** to the Core Member (CM) for 18 months → personal interviews (minimum 1/month)
Group meetings of the CM and **volunteers** → weekly, fortnightly and monthly
- Cultural, leisure and work** outings of the CM with volunteers → monthly
- Personalized attention** to the CM via mobile phone → permanent
- Assessments**, coordinations and information of the results to the Outer Circle (prison referees) → quarterly
- Activities in open regime prisons** → daily, weekly, fortnightly and monthly
